Dr. Claire Ferguson is a Senior Lecturer and researcher in the School of Justice at Queensland University of Technology in Brisbane Australia. With her background in psychology and criminology, Claire’s work bridges the gap between academic research and forensic case work in complex death investigations. While she has published over 40 academic articles in many traditional journals, she also uses the research to inform training and expert consultancy for assisting police, attorneys, and Coroners investigating missing persons, equivocal deaths, and suspected homicides.
